On 4-19-09 at approximately 0533 hrs, the Colorado Springs Police Communications Center received a 911 call reporting a shooting. The caller was an unknown race male who identified himself as Jovan and reported he had a gun. Officers from the Colorado Springs Police Department Sand Creek Sub-Division were dispatched to the address 2444 Platte Place where they contacted three males and one was holding a handgun. Officer Hengst contacted the males and he was directed to a small shed on the property where he found a white male on his back. It appeared the male had a head injury and possibly a gun shot wound to his chest. Medical personnel arrived on scene and determined the male was deceased. Members of the violent Crimes/Homicide Investigations Unit responded.

NARRATIVE	Patrol/sjr Officer Tim L. Donovan, 3083 <u>INITIAL INFORMATION</u> On 04-19-09, at approximately 0532 hours, I, Officer Tim L. Donovan, 3083, along with numerous other officers responded to 2444 Platte Place to investigate a reported shooting. <u>OFFICER STATEMENT</u> I responded to the scene in a Code 3 manner with my lights and sirens on. As I approached the scene I traveled eastbound on Platte Place and positioned my police cruiser at approximately 2438 Platte Place , partially blocking the roadway. As I approached 2444 Platte Place on foot, I observed that several police units and an American Medical Response ambulance was already on scene. I quickly returned to my police cruiser and retrieved my digital camera and then returned to the scene on foot. I located the victim lying in the doorway of a small shed. The victim appeared to be a white male and he was laying on his right side with his head protruding out the partially open door. There was a large pool of blood beneath the victim's head. I took several digital photographs of the victim and the shed. American Medical Response personnel were attending to the victim, and one of the medics stated that he felt a faint pulse on the victim's neck. At that time, medical personnel partially pulled the victim from where he was laying onto his back on a backboard just outside the shed door. The victim appeared to have an unknown type of wound to the right side of his head and there was blood on his head and face. Medical personnel then opened the victim's clothing on his torso and one of the medics stated that he saw what he believed to be a gunshot wound to the right mid-section of the victim's torso. I then took additional photographs of the victim. A few moments later, medical personnel informed me that the victim no longer had a pulse and they ceased providing medical attention. While checking the area around the victim for items of evidentiary value, I observed a possible bullet hole in the door to the shed where the victim had been located and also a few feet from the victim to the north and west lying on a trailer I observed a silver in color, approximately three feet long, metal pipe. I took additional digital photographs of the shed door and the silver pipe. While on scene, I provided a license plate number to Dispatch for a vehicle that was parked at the scene. I also provided several vehicle identification numbers for other vehicles that were parked in the scene that did not have license plates attached. After completion within the scene, I returned to my police cruiser and maintained scene security. No unauthorized personnel entered the scene from my location while I was at my post. Major Crimes detectives arrived and took control of the scene, and I met with Sgt. J. Jensen and apprised him of my part in the initial contact at the scene and I showed him the digital photographs I had taken at the scene. Upon completion at the scene, I returned to the Sand Creek Substation, where I placed the digital photographs into evidence. Nothing further at this time.

INITIAL INFORMATION

On 04-19-09, at approximately 0534 hours, officers from the Sand Creek Substation were dispatched to **2444 Platte Place** to investigate a reported shooting. At the time I was not dispatched to the call for service; however, I was in fairly close proximity at the intersection of Airport and S. Circle Dr. and responded to the scene.

Upon arrival on the scene at approximately 0537 hours, I advised Communications that I was on scene.

OFFICER STATEMENT

Upon arrival on scene, Officer Crofoot and Officer Hengst were already on scene. I observed that 2444 Platte Place is located on the north side of the road just west of Weld. I observed two cruisers, one partially in the driveway of 2444 Platte Place and the other on Platte Place. I pulled up behind those cruisers and immediately walked towards where I had heard them.

As I walked northbound into 2444 Platte Place, I observed a fence around the property with an open access gate for vehicle traffic. This appeared to be some sort of auto sales place or auto repair shop. As I immediately walked onto the property, I observed Officer Crofoot, who was in contact with numerous individuals. Officer Crofoot advised me to conduct a pat down of the individuals and secure them separate from each other pending further investigation. At that time, Officer White, who had been riding with me, contacted one individual and I contacted the other two.

The first individual that I contacted I advised to take his hands out of his pockets and secured them behind his back while I conducted a pat down search. The other individual I had him place his hands in the air until he could be attended to. The individual that I had contacted was identified as **LJUBAN MILANOVIC** (DOB: 03-12-53). While I was conducting a pat down for weapons of this individual, Officer Vanderlinden came to assist me with the other individual. Please see his supplement for further details.

After conducting a pat down search of Mr. Milanovic, I took him to my police cruiser to secure him in the back of it pending further investigation. While walking to the cruiser, he advised me that he was the father of the individual that Officer White was in contact with. After securing Mr. Milanovic, I then walked back towards Officer White's location and overheard him telling her about there possibly being another suspect involved who had fled northbound from the scene.

At that point, Officer Crofoot and I walked to the north side of 2444 Platte Place to check for any persons that were possibly hiding on the property, or injured. Officer Crofoot and I did not locate anyone on the property.

While I was checking the north side of the property, a vehicle was scene driving westbound on the north side of the property on, I believe, Boulder. At that time, I flagged the male down and he rolled down his window. I asked him if he had seen anything that went on and his first remarks out of his mouth were, "Did they shoot someone?"

At that time, I asked if he would mind stepping out of the vehicle and to talk to me further. I did not advise him that anyone had been shot and I spoke to the individual through a chainlink fence separating the property from the street. I asked if he minded providing his identification, and he provided a Colorado driver's license to me. I obtained the following information from him. ...

Upon speaking to Mr. Sorensen, I asked why he asked me if someone had been shot. He stated that he had spoken to the individuals who own the property at 2444 Platte Place, as he worked just a few businesses west of them. He stated that he had spoken to them numerous times over the past week, and had been advised by them that they had numerous burglaries in which one of the burglaries a bunch of keys to cars that they had in their lot had been taken. He stated that he had talked to them the day before, which would have been 04-18-09, and they had talked about the burglaries further and stated that they were going to stay on the property through the night of 04-18-09 to 04-19-09, and see if anyone came to burglarize their property. He further stated that he seemed to believe that they were pretty good people; however, he knew that some of them had been in the military.

I asked him if they said that they were going to shoot anyone if they came onto their property. He stated that they did not say that, but he got an impression that that's what they were going to try to do. Again, I confirmed with him, since he asked me if they had shot anyone, whether they had stated that, and he said no, he just had that feeling and after seeing all the police cars and the ambulance, he believed that is what had happened.

Mr. Sorensen did not have any further information to provide.

OFFICER STATEMENT CONTINUED

After speaking to Mr. Sorensen, I then walked back to the south side of 2444 Platte Place, where I walked out into the middle of the street where it had already been taped off with crime scene tape. At that point, I met with Sgt. Walsh, who indicated that the homicide detectives would be responding to the scene. At that time, she advised to stand by until further direction from her or the detectives. At that time, I stood in the roadway in the 2400 block of Platte Place until I was directed otherwise as scene security.

At approximately 0741 hours, I was contacted by Lt. Rigdon and also a Homicide detective, who instructed me to take the individual that I had in my police cruiser, Mr. Milanovic, to the **Police Operations Center** to the Homicide Unit for further questioning. Upon arrival there at approximately 0748 hours, I was instructed to complete a gunshot residue evidence collection kit on Mr. Milanovic. At that time, at approximately 0804 hours, I completed the gunshot residue evidence collection kit where I swabbed Mr. Milanovic's both hands to include the back and palm area, and also to include his face, following the directions of the gunshot residue evidence collection kit.

After completing the kit, I was then advised that I could leave the Police Operations Center, at which time I left at approximately 0824 hours, and returned to the Sand Creek Substation, arriving at the Sand Creek Substation at approximately 0837 hours, where I placed the gunshot residue evidence collection kit into evidence at the Sand Creek Substation. After completing the evidence and securing it, I then completed this dictation, which concludes my involvement with this investigation.

Officer Statement:

On 04-19-09 at 0551 hours, I, Officer M. Enger (2A61/2147p) was dispatched to 2444 East Platte Place to cover Sand Creek Officers responding to a shooting incident. Upon arrival at 0551 hours, I checked the area for a possible suspect reported running from the area. The suspect was described as a white male wearing a black stocking cap.

At 0557 hours, dispatched advised of a burglary alarm at a business located nearby at 2425 East Platte Place which was about 1 block west of the crime scene. Officer Gustavson (2A31/2147p) and I parked our cruisers in the area and checked around the fenced business on foot. At 0604 hours, while walking in a north/west alleyway on the north side of the 2400 block of East Platte Place (just east of Auto Tech Plaza) I observed a silver object on the ground in the middle of the alleyway. I picked up the item and realized it was a silver-colored cell phone. I placed the cell phone back on the ground and advised dispatch of my discovery.

I was dispatched to scene perimeter at St. Vrain Street and Yuma Street at 0610 hours at which point Officer Gustavson stayed with the cell phone which remained in the alleyway. I cleared perimeter containment per incident command at 0730 hours.

Officer Statement: On 4/19/09 at 0547 hours, I Ofc Gustavson, 2151, was dispatched to 2444 Platte Pl to assist Sand Creek units with a shooting call. Sand Creek units were already on scene, and advised that a suspect possibly fled the scene before their arrival. The only description for this suspect was a white male with a stocking cap, who was possibly last seen northbound on foot from the scene.

Upon my arrival at 0552 hours, at the request of units on scene, I checked the area for this possible suspect, but was unable to locate anybody in the area.

At approx 0555 hours, dispatch requested that I check the address at 2425 Platte Pl, Layton Truck Equipment Company, due to a code 8 burglary alarm. Upon my arrival, I observed that this location was approx 1/2 block west of the crime scene. I checked the perimeter of this property, which was completely enclosed by a chain link fence, and I was unable to access the building.

I, Ofc Gustavson, 2151, and Ofc Lujan, 460, set up a perimeter around the property to wait for a k-9 track in case the suspect was inside the building. At approx 0605 hours, while I was at the north side of the property, Ofc Enger, 2147, advised that he located a cell phone on the ground in an alleyway, just east of the Auto Tech Plaza at 2353 E Platte Ave, directly across the street from Layton Truck Equipment Company. Ofc Enger was en route to set up containment on the east perimeter of the scene, and therefore I then positioned my police cruiser in order to view both Layton Truck Equipment property and the cell phone.

At approx 0630, while at this location, I was contacted by Layton Truck Equipment Company manager Rich Tupper, (719) 761-1893. Tupper advised that he was contacted by his alarm company regarding the alarm. Tupper stated that the entire interior and exterior of the property is monitored by cameras. Tupper stated the cameras do not turn on unless there is movement on the property. Tupper advised that the alarm company told him that they monitored the cameras, and nobody entered the property. Tupper stated that cameras were probably set off by the Police cruiser lights.

Tupper further advised that it is possible that one of the cameras might have footage of events to the north of the property line, along Platte Pl., which is where the crime scene is located. Tupper stated that he could obtain the recordings from these cameras if he was requested to do so.

I advised Lt Rigdon at the scene of the possibility that these cameras may contain footage of the crime scene.

I continued to monitor the cell phone in the alleyway until it was collected by crime lab personnel at approx 0800 hours.

At this time, I took over scene security for Ofc Reeser at the north end of the crime scene, directly in front of 2443 Gunnison St. I remained at this location until I was relieved by Ofc Carrier at approx 1315 hours.

NARRATIVE	<p>Supplemental Information</p> <p>On 04/19/09 at approximately 0635 hours, I (Officer S. Worley 1123) observed a yellow cab in the area of 1400 S. Chelton Road. Dispatch had aired a few minutes earlier that a yellow cab had picked up a male giving the name of "Chris" from the Wal-Mart located at 3201 E. Platte Avenue, and they were enroute to 1400 S. Chelton Road. I observed the yellow cab pull into the east parking lot of the Verde Meadows apartment complex, and I contacted the passenger as he was getting out of the cab.</p> <p>The passenger provided Colorado driver's license number [REDACTED] for identification. The driver's license identified this person as Christopher John Carpenter DOB: 12/05/51, and showed an address of 1470 S. Chelton Road apt #248. Mr. Carpenter stated he currently lives in apartment #250.</p> <p>Mr. Carpenter was wearing a yellow & black colored jacket, a blue shirt, and blue jeans. He is described as a white male with long straight blonde hair and green eyes. He is listed as 6' 1" tall, weighing approximately 205 pounds. He provided his contact telephone numbers of home ([REDACTED]) and cell ([REDACTED]), and he stated he works at "Atmel" on Cheyenne Road.</p> <p>Mr. Carpenter stated he had taken a yellow cab to the Wal-Mart store on Platte Avenue and Chelton Road, and after he finished shopping, he took a yellow cab home.</p> <p>I conducted a pat down search for weapons on Mr. Carpenter and no weapon was found. He appeared calm during my contact with him, and had several Wal-Mart bags which he removed from the rear of the taxi. I completed FIR card #598244 for my contact with him. I turned the FIR card into the shift one box at the Sand Creek substation and advised the supervisor on scene of the homicide at 2444 Platte Place of my contact. I made a photocopy of my FIR card and attached it to this supplement. While I was enroute, CSPD Dispatch advised they had received a phone call indicating a male subject at this address had possibly been shot and was bleeding. While I was still enroute to the area, CSPD Dispatch updated the call screen and informed officers responding the caller stated that the male subject who was on scene was not shot; however, he fell down and was bleeding. <u>ARRIVAL ON SCENE</u> At approximately 0536 hours, I, along with Officer E. Crofoot, 3511P , arrived on scene and upon exiting my vehicle, I noticed three white male subjects standing in the driveway/parking area of this address. The address where this incident occurred is a car repair shop with the business name of Southwest Auto Sales, and the lot is enclosed by a chain link fence on each side of the lot. The lot within the fence is open with space to park numerous vehicles, and there were numerous vehicles parked in different areas of the lot. When I exited my vehicle, I noticed one male subject was standing on the south side of the property pointing northward, indicating to me the individual who was injured was in that direction. After observing this individual, I noticed another individual standing approximately 20 feet north of the first male who was also indicating the victim, was north of his location. After observing this second individual, I observed a third subject standing approximately seven to ten feet to the northeast of the second subject. When I looked at the third individual, I noticed he was holding what appeared to be a silver colored handgun in his right hand, holding it pointed up in the air. When I observed this, I heard Officer Crofoot giving verbal commands to this individual to drop the gun, and I also began to instruct the individual to drop the weapon. When I noticed the individual holding the handgun, I was approximately 10 feet away from him and I observed him reach down and place the handgun on the trunk of a silver colored sedan in the parking lot. Once this individual, later identified as Jovan Milanovic, DOB: 03/13/79 , placed the handgun down, I overheard the other two male individuals stating there were other subjects who had fled the scene. Given the fact that it was unknown how many people were in the lot and the fact that the lot was open and there were many places to hide, I took possession of the handgun and handed it to Officer Crofoot so it could be secured. As the handgun was being secured, officers detained all three male individuals who were in the lot and I then approached a small shed which was located to the north of the entrance of the lot. While the three males were being detained, they stated the male subject who was injured was lying in the shed, so given this information I approached this building in an attempt to locate the possible victim. <u>LOCATION OF VICTIM</u> Once I reached the small shed, I noticed that the door was propped half way open and I saw what appeared to be a white male subject (Unknown Identity) lying partially on his right side and partially face down, with his body inside the shed and his head outside of the shed. As I looked closer, I noticed what appeared to be blood pooling underneath the victim's head. At first glance, it appeared as though the individual had suffered a gunshot wound to the head. victim's neck using my right index finger and middle finger; however, I was unable to detect a pulse or any signs of life in the individual. When I checked the victim for a pulse, his body was warm to the touch and laid limp on the ground. As I was doing this, additional officers on scene began to check the rest of the lot, to ensure the lot was secure. I subsequently advised CSPD dispatch of the victim's condition and members of American Medical Response (AMR) were summoned to respond to the scene.

While I was waiting for AMR to respond, I observed what appeared to be a small hole in the door of the shed where I located the victim. This hole appeared to be caused by an object passing through it, and it appeared consistent with that of a bullet hole. Upon observing this hole in the door, it appeared as though the object that caused the hole traveled through the door from the outside in, due to the outer area of the hole pushing inward. This area was smooth and consistent with that of an object entering the door. The area on the inside of the door where the object passed through was shattered and was not smooth, consistent with that of an object forcefully penetrating and exiting the door. Additionally, I noticed there was a metal pipe lying on a flat bed trailer that was by the shed where the victim was located. It is unknown if the individuals on scene had been armed with this pipe, or if it had been on the trailer throughout the incident. Due to the location of the pipe and the blood I observed pooling under the victim's head, this pipe and its location was documented.

Once AMR personnel arrived on scene, I informed them of the location of the victim and they checked the victim attempting to locate any signs of life. After checking the victim, one of the AMR medics advised he did not detect a pulse or signs of life. As I had been checking the victim, **Officer T. Donovan**, 3083P, began to take photographs of the scene with his digital camera. After the first AMR member checked the victim, a second member of AMR decided to check the victim for signs of life and he believed he had located a pulse, "two beats". Due to this possible pulse, AMR rolled the victim onto his back and after attaching the victim to one of their monitors, advised they could not locate any signs of life, and the victim was deceased. Once AMR informed me of this information, AMR left the scene and officer's secured the area, leaving the victim's body where it was located.

SECURING THE SCENE

At this time, I began to look around the scene to ensure there were no other suspects or individuals who were injured or hiding. As I was checking, Officer Crofoot and I were instructed to relay the VIN numbers and license plate numbers on several of the vehicles that were parked inside the businesses lot to dispatch. Officer Crofoot and I relayed the vehicle information for numerous vehicles to Dispatch and did not locate any other suspects or any other victims in the area upon conducting a secondary search. Once Officer Crofoot and I completed this, we exited the inner perimeter of the scene and took up a position of scene security with other officers while we awaited the arrival of Major Crimes detectives.

While I was waiting the arrival of Major Crimes, I took position of scene security on the south side of the address where the incident occurred. I stood on Platte Place at the south driveway to the address and ensured no other individuals entered the scene.

WALK THROUGH OF THE SCENE WITH DETECTIVE R. GYSIN

Once Major Crimes **Detective R. Gysin**, 042D, arrived on scene, he asked who was the first responding officer and I informed him I had arrived on scene first. At that time, Detective Gysin asked me to walk him through the scene and explain to him what I observed when I arrived. I subsequently walked Detective Gysin through my actions and what I observed when I first arrived. After this was completed, I again exited the crime scene to the outer perimeter and took up a position of scene security a second time.

OFFICER STATEMENT

When I first arrived on scene, Officer Crofoot and I secured the weapon Mr. Milanovic was holding and the individuals who were present in the lot were secured and detained. While I was checking the victim for a pulse, I overheard someone state they believed they heard two gunshots fired from outside of one of buildings contained inside the lot, and one of the individuals on scene observed one male fleeing the area northbound. one of the individuals on scene state they believed the individual who fled the scene, fired two shots into the air as he was jumping over the fence on the north side of the address. I relayed this information to Detective Gysin; however, I do not know who made these comments.

As I had been checking the victim's body for signs of life, numerous other officers of the Sand Creek Division arrived on scene and they began to assist Officer Crofoot and I with the identification and gathering of information from the three individuals I observed when Officer Crofoot and I arrived. Throughout the entire time I was on scene, I did not speak to any of these individuals and their identities are unknown to me.

Once I had walked Detective Gysin through the scene, **Detective M. Montez**, 971D, spoke with an individual who had been detained in the backseat of Officer Crofoot's vehicle. When I arrived on scene, I parked my vehicle partially in the driveway of the address and therefore, my vehicle had been secured within the inner perimeter of the scene. Due to my vehicle being contained inside the scene, I asked Detective Montez if I could enter the scene to obtain some personal belongings from my police vehicle. Detective Montez informed me that I could enter the scene to gather these items, so I entered the inner perimeter and obtained these items from my vehicle. Once I had gathered the items I needed, I exited the inner perimeter.

TRANSPORT OF INDIVIDUAL TO POC

After this was completed, Detective Montez asked Officer Crofoot to transport the individual detained in his vehicle to the Police Operations Center (POC) located at 705 S. Nevada Avenue for interview. I subsequently left my police vehicle on scene and with the permission of the Major Crimes detectives, left the scene and rode with Officer Crofoot to the POC. Once Officer Crofoot and I secured the individual from his vehicle in an interview room at the POC, we responded to the Sand Creek Substation where we cleared this call and called off shift.

I arrived at 2444 Platte Place at approximately 0539 hours. When I arrived on scene, there were already several officers there. I observed 2444 Platte Place to be on the north side of Platte Place. As I approached the chained off, what appeared to be a small parking lot area, I observed that officers had two individuals detained and there was a third one standing in the middle of the parking lot area with his hands up in the air. I immediately moved to that individual and patted him down for weapons and detained him. This individual was identified as Srdjan Novak , DOB: 08/31/75. After determining that Mr. Novak had no weapons in his possession, I placed him into handcuffs and placed him in the back of the nearest patrol cruiser. I advised him at that time he was not under arrest; he was being detained until we were able to investigate the situation and determine what had happened. Mr. Novak was cooperative and stated to me that he understood and at that point in time, I placed him in the back of a patrol car.			
<u>RECOVERY OF GUN</u>			
After I placed Mr. Novak in the back of a patrol car, I was approached by Officer E. Crofoot , 3511. Officer Crofoot handed me a silver colored Jennings 9mm handgun and requested that I make the weapon secure. At that point in time while I was wearing gloves, I ejected the magazine from the handgun which did contain five rounds although I did not count how many. I then ejected one live round from the chamber and locked the slide back. At that point in time, I placed the gun in the trunk of my patrol cruiser (#3659). I secured the handgun itself, the magazine with all rounds still inside the magazine and the one additional round that I recovered from the chamber of the handgun and locked them in the trunk of my patrol cruiser.			
<u>OFFICER STATEMENT</u>			
After securing what was believed to be the suspected weapon involved in the shooting in the back of my patrol cruiser at the request of Sgt. M. Walsh , 169, I set up crime scene tape blocking off the roadway from Platte Place east of the crime scene on Weld Street.

Overflow from Narrative:

On 04/19/09 at approximately 0555 hours, I, Officer Vanderlinden, interviewed Mr. Novak regarding this situation. At that point in time, Mr. Novak had been released from handcuffs and was seated in the back of Officer Crofoot's patrol cruiser. I interviewed Mr. Novak from the front seat of the patrol cruiser while he was seated in the back of the patrol car.

I asked Mr. Novak to explain to me what had been going on and he advised me that they had been having issues with people breaking into the business recently and stealing stereos and other items from the vehicles parked out front. He stated that he, another male whom he identified as **Jovan** and Mr. Novak's father-in-law, **Ljuban**, had been sleeping over at the business due to the burglaries. He advised this was the first time since they began sleeping at the business that anyone had attempted to break into the business.

I asked Mr. Novak to describe to me what specifically had happened this morning. He stated that he, Jovan and Ljuban were hanging out in the small building which appeared to be a house or an office inside the gated and fenced in area at 2444 Platte Place. I asked him if they were sleeping at all and he stated that they were just kind of hanging out. He stated that he could see out a window through the front of the business and he observed two males jumping the fence. I asked him if he could describe to me what they looked like and he stated it was very dark and he could only see two male figures that appeared to be jumping the fence and running. I asked him if he got a good look at them and he stated no, it was very dark. Mr. Novak stated that all three of them went outside of the building to confront them but inside the fenced in area. Mr. Novak stated again that it was dark and that everything happened fast. He stated that he heard the gun fired one time. He stated that after he heard the gun fired one time, he went back to the small house or office building. He stated that he thought that the two males were gone and at that point in time, he stated that Jovan had called the police.

I asked Mr. Novak if there was anything that he could tell me about the two males that had jumped over the fence and he stated again that he only saw that there were two of them and reiterated the fact that it was dark and that they were running. He stated that everything happened fast and he estimated that it all happened in approximately five seconds.

I asked Mr. Novak if he was aware that Jovan had a gun on his person and Mr. Novak stated yes. He did know that Jovan had a gun on him. At that point in time, I concluded my interview. I concluded my interview with Mr. Novak and advised him that he was going to need to be patient and that detectives were going to want to speak with him. Mr. Novak remained cooperative and stated that that would be ok.

OFFICER STATEMENT CONTINUED

After concluding my interview with Mr. Novak, Sgt. Walsh requested that I run the serial number on the gun to determine if it has been registered or stolen. At that point in time, I returned to my patrol cruiser and ran the handgun that was recovered by Officer Crofoot via Dispatch. The gun was identified as a Jennings 9mm handgun, silver in color. The serial number on the weapon was 1396788. Dispatch advised that this serial number came back with no record found.

A short time later, a member of the Metro Crime Lab arrived on scene and recovered the handgun from the trunk of my patrol cruiser, as well as photographed the handgun in the back of my cruiser. The gun was taken by him and placed into evidence.

TRANSPORT OF SUSPECT TO THE POLICE OPERATIONS CENTER

On 04/19/09 at approximately 0759 hours, I, Officer Vanderlinden, transported a male, who at that point in time was believed to be the possible suspect in the shooting and was identified as **Jovan Milanovic**, DOB: 03/13/79, to the Police Operations Center (POC). I informed Mr. Milanovic that we were going to go to the POC and that detectives wished to interview him there. At that point in time, Mr. Milanovic began to speak about the incident. I informed him quickly that detectives would appreciate it if he spoke to them there instead of discussing the matter with me. Mr. Milanovic stated that he understood and at that point in time, we continued on to the Police Operations Center. We arrived at the POC at approximately 0809 hours. At that point in time, I walked Mr. Milanovic up to an interview room on the second floor with **Detective M. Hale**, 1755D. At that point in time, Mr. ...
